



## Notes

- 1. extra 1'0" at Raeburn House Hotel increasing to extra 2'0" and then decreasing to extra 6" at North Park Terrace.
- 2. Location determined by Faro Focus 150 laser Faro 2019 software accurate to +/- 10mm (0.4").
- 3. In 1912, following years of complaints and representations by local residents and the "Burgh", the Grange and Academical Trust as proprietors, together with the Edinburgh Academical Club as tenants, contracted to "give up" (not "sell") 6' of ground from the south side of the Estate wall. The 1912 contract states "the Third Parties (The Burgh) shall remove the existing boundary wall on the said strip..... erect a new boundary wall along the frontage..... as widened".
- 4. In exchange for "giving up" the 6' strip the Burgh agreed to build a new 6' high wall, "smooth faced with a pointed serrated surmount to prevent climbing" and contracted to maintain the 1912 Wall in "all time coming".
- 5. The 1912 Wall, built consequent to, but subsequent to, the agreement, was built on Trust property north of the position shown on the demonstrative plan accompanying the contract governing the "giving up" of the 6' strip.
- 6. The 1912 Wall was built beyond (north of) the 6' strip in a straight line, beyond (north of) the 6' strip by an "extra" distance varying with the "wiggles" of the Estate Boundary wall.
